






Financial: TinyTap reimburses me for my travel expenses for today's presentation, and are currently processing a few of my apps for sale.








Student C is an African American female in the third grade who came to our school in the beginning of September of this school year, already receiving speech services for an articulation disorder. Although she receives services from the ALP (gifted) program, she demonstrated a pattern of excessive absences which impacted her participation in therapy sessions, many of which were unexcused. This pattern had also been seen at her previous school. Contact by the school social worker had minimal effect. At the end of November, her speech group was introduced to TinyTap apps for accessing homework online,

and in December the group began using TinyTap to complete personal projects for speech class. Student C's missed therapy sessions due to absences decreased from 50% in November to 0% in December, January, and February. She is currently creating speech homework apps for other students using TinyTap.

### EFFECTIVE: TinyTap's impact for student with attention deficits

Student S is a bilingual male in the third grade who demonstrated significant difficulties with attention, resulting in lack of progress on narrative goals and objectives. As this student was easily mastering his other language goals in a small group setting, it was suspected that his inconsistent performance with retelling storieswas due to his fluctuating attention rather than a true language disorder.


In December, a new therapy approach was introduced using TinyTap activities created by the SLP for learning narrative skills on the iPad. Student S immediately


became more engaged and

attentive to the stories, and achieved a 100% average for the month of December, confirming that his performance had been impacted by his attention. His speech/language testing was updated and showed all languages kills within the average range and sufficient for dismissal from the Speech Impaired Program.













































Image Editing Tip: To get rid of a colored background, use Cut My Pic (or other photo editing app), or search for a .png graphic file online.
